FAIRsharing offers...

1 rich and discoverable descriptions of standards and databases



2 relationship graphs to identify data* resources similar and related to yours



FAIRsharing supports you to:



Navigate the wealth of standards and databases by providing a rich description and visualisations of the relationships, their life cycle status, and evolution



Increase the citability and discoverability (by humans and machine) of the resource you develop or maintain, and the personal and organisational attribution through DOIs, ORCID and ROR global identifiers



Use FAIRsharing to discover existing resources, to avoid duplication or for compliance, and the organisations behind them, e.g. to explore collaboration

To support FAIRsharing you can:



Register or claim your resources in FAIRsharing, describing their content, scope, and relationships, and use DOIs assigned to your records in relevant documentation and training material



Endorse it as a trusted informational and educational resource on the evolving landscape of databases and standards



Enrich its content and put your expertise into action by joining the FAIRsharing Community Champions programme, gaining recognition, professional development, and influence

Reach out to FAIRsharing to collaborate on guidance and collections of databases and standards related to the organisation you are part of, and specific to your users' needs
